You should **ALL** know that we live in England which is part of the UK.

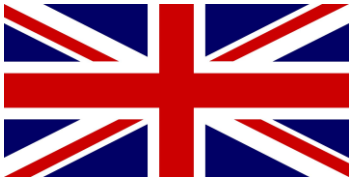

<b>UK</b> - is short for United Kingdom and includes England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.	<b>country</b> - A country is land that is controlled by a single government.	<b>capital city</b> - is a city or town where the central government of a country is.
<b>county</b> -	<b>landmark</b> - are features or structures around the world that are easily recognised or unique. They can be natural or man-made.	<b>continent</b> - a large, solid area of land that is considered a collective region. The Earth has seven continents.
